Delk Koolman, our Neighborhood Development Specialist informed us of some upcoming events with Neighbors Building Neighborhoods. The next Five Points Task Force Meeting will be Thursday, March 16th at the Norview Community Center at 6:30 PM. There will be an update on the park.
