Our CRO Officer Trojhan gave us the crime stats for the last 30 days. He informed us that car thefts and larcenies were up and burglaries were down. Do not leave your cars running unattended in the morning to warm up. Q&A's followed.

Michele Morgan, Life Safety Educator, Officer of Public Affairs educated us on what to do and not to do to keep your home and yourself safe from fires. She informed us from Nov. 2017 thru Feb. 2018 there were 49 fires, 2 deaths, and 1 trauma in our city. Be careful and cautious using space heaters and also have an escape plan to get out of your home during a fire. A Q&A session followed.

Treasurer Theresa Russell gave the report of income and expenses for the last month and noted a balance of \$6,168.24 in the Treasury. Carolyn Foca reported we made \$160 from the recent Craft Show and \$130.00 from the bake sale.

The president made announcements of upcoming civic league activities.

Representatives from PAR5 Development Group returned this month and gave a presentation for people who were not present last month. They took questions and concerns about the zoning change and building Dollar General on the old Valero Gas Station lot. Jim Fisher from East Fairmount had a petition for people to sign who were for or against the zoning change.

Living Legacy Groves



Living Legacy Groves are planned groupings of trees and other native plantings on City of Norfolk property, made possible by donations from residents, businesses, and nonprofit organizations. The groves are accessible to the public, will include educational signage and are planted in areas earmarked for restoration. The first Living Legacy Grove is located in Lakewood Park, on the Lafayette River. The grove was planted in spring 2010 with trees contributed by the Elizabeth

River Project and the Chesapeake Bay Foundation, supported by a Chesapeake Bay Small Watershed Grant from the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation, using funds from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

The Living Legacy Groves will be made up of native trees and will not be mowed in order to permit the development of a natural ecosystem within the grove. This design helps retain soil and storm water on the site, aids in carbon uptake, and provides habitat for birds and other wildlife. Over time, additional Living Legacy Groves will be added throughout the city in public spaces that will accommodate additional trees.

Donating to the Living Legacy Groves project is a natural, lasting way to mark occasions such as a birth, graduation, or anniversary and to honor or remember a special person or favorite pet. For individuals and businesses lacking space to plant a tree, donating to the Living Legacy Grove fund is a great way to give back to your community and help the environment. Smart Tips for Yard and Garden Care



Create a lush, beautiful lawn without using harmful fertilizers or treatments that harm our waterways. Aerating and laying down a quarter inch of compost in spring and fall provides valuable nutrients to keep your lawn healthy. Allowing 5% of white clover to grow in your lawn adds nitrogen, eliminating the need to fertilize. Setting your lawnmower at least 2 1/2 " - 3" high protects roots from drying out and helps grass overcome weeds and pests. Consider planting milkweed in a corner of your yard to

attract Monarch butterflies and other native pollinators. Monarchs are not only fascinating to watch but they also help pollinate your backyard vegetable gardens.

Norfolk City codes prohibit allowing leaves, grass clippings, and other yard debris from entering the city storm water drainage system. These items clog storm sewer grates and pipes. Homeowners are responsible for keeping corner drains clear of debris. Trimmed, healthy lawns make a neighborhood like Estabrook look beautiful. But what to do about grass clippings that endup on the driveway and sidewalks? Clippings should always be swept up. Because grass is mostly made of water held together with green stuff that breaks down quickly, it can be added to your composter or just left on the lawn for added moisture and nitrogen.


